
ADVOCACY & VOICE

We will enhance the voices of our members:

- Share quality information and knowledge for members to enable informed choices.
- We will continue to extend our individual advocacy supporting members.
- Become a centre of excellence for CP knowledge in NZ.
- Continue to grow and expand the Youth Alliance initiatives for ongoing leadership and advocacy in partnership with the Ministry of Youth Affairs.
- Maintain a physical disability consortium to prioritse initiatives strengthening opportunities for member's employment and youth transitions with a focus on education, health and social interactions.
- CPS will work in partnership with the Paediatric Society and Starship to develop a CP network focusing on development of best practice recommendations for early diagnosis and treatment; improving the transition from paediatric to adult services; supporting the CP Register; hearing the voice of children, young people and families; SDR and intensives.
- CPS is funding an external investigation of the cost benefit analysis of intensive services versus status quo.
- Partner with organisations to advocate for people with physical disability.




FINANCE

We will strategise with our members to create innovative solutions. We will:

- Co-design with the Youth Alliance solutions focused on transition in health care for young people living with physical disabilities.
- Design and develop strategies to improve support for families with a child newly diagnosed with CP. The proposed solutions are based on feedback from our members.

Programmes Achieved

What Our 2018

Grants

Over 309 members were able to purchase equipment and services through our grants programme, enhancing their independence and freedom.

getPhysical

These vouchers helped over 479 children and adults with cerebral palsy to get active in ways best suited to their individual needs.

getUpAgain

Over 36 members were able to access professional counselling, advice and support through this programme.

getOutThere

Approximately 693 people with cerebral palsy were able to gain greater access to their communities by using these vouchers.

getStructured

14 parents were given financial assistance to set up a legal framework around their child with cerebral palsy, thanks to this programme.

getThis&That

These vouchers assisted over 464 members to purchase small items needed daily to manage living with cerebral palsy.
