### Approval of Research Contract between CP Society & NZ CP Register

Board approval requested for a 3 year sub-contracting agreement between the NZ CP Register and the CP Society as follows:

Earlier in the year, the NZCPR submitted a proposal to HRC around oral health of children with CP- short name ORAL-CP. This proposed data linkage between the NZCPR and the ministry databases to look at oral health service delivery in NZ (which we know can be improved) and some co-design work to look at better ways to deliver oral health care to children with CP.

Amy was named as an associate investigator on that grant, in her role as researcher for the CP Society.

NZCPR have now been invited to provide a full proposal which now presents a good chance of success and funding for three years.

NZCPR will need to do a sub-contract with the CP Society as Amy's employer and are proposing a salary of 0.05FTE for Amy over the three years of the grant i.e., 2 hours per week for advice on the areas of data analysis / presentation etc. with Amy providing that critical structural lens of lived experience in her role as researcher for the CP Society.

Amy's input has been described as the following:

• Amy Hogan - Researcher, CP Society. Named investigator on grant and will support all objectives, providing critical structural lens for data ascertainment and analysis based on lived experience of CP and acting as research representative of CP Society.

This work will remain within Amy's current contracted weekly hours in her role as researcher for the CP Society.

Once approved, an agreement between the University of Auckland and the CP Society will be signed.
